Tony Lombardo was appointed Chief Executive Officer Asia in May 2016 and is based in Singapore. The Asian business has grown in that time, with capital deployed increasing from A\$0.5B to \$1B, with corresponding 4x increase in EBITDA over the last three years. Tony was previously Group Chief Financial Officer based in Sydney from November 2011 to May 2016. He joined Lendlease in July 2007 as Group Head of Strategy and Mergers & Acquisitions (M&A). In this role, Tony led a number of initiatives including refocusing the Group's overall business strategy.

Before joining Lendlease, Tony spent almost ten years at GE, with responsibilities across numerous functional disciplines including Strategy, Mergers & Acquisitions and Finance, for both GE Capital and GE Corporate. Tony gained international experience during his last three and a half years with GE Capital. Based in Connecticut, USA, Tony was Vice President - Strategy of GE Money and prior to that Director of M&A, where he was successfully closed six international transactions across Eastern Europe and SE Asia. Previously, Tony worked at KPMG in Audit for four and a half years.

Jimmy Khoo is the Chief Executive Officer of Singapore District Cooling (SDC), a key subsidiary of the Singapore Power group of Companies. SDC provides centralized production of chilled water in the premium district of Marina Bay and is the largest fully underground network in the world. He previously headed SP Group’s Business Ventures responsible for commercial and technology initiatives and various operational roles such as the grid planning division and Singapore’s Liquefied Natural Gas Terminal project. He has also been involved in overseas projects, being the Managing Director (Australia Investments) based in Melbourne. He was previously a Brigadier General holding senior appointments in the Ministry of Defense. He led the Joint Staff and the Future Systems Directorate responsible for disruptive technologies and led the initiative to transform the Singapore Armed Forces in the early 2000s.
